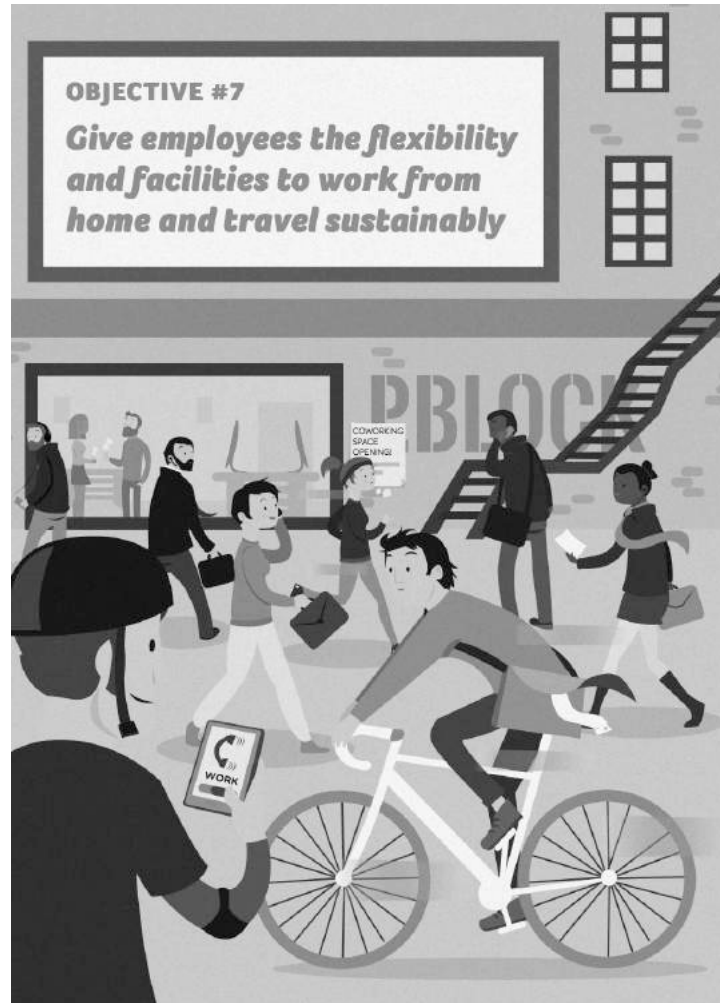

#07 A GOOD TRANSPORT PLAN FOR BRISTOL

Create flexible and sustainable travel options for employees

Bristol's businesses are vital in helping to improve our city and its streets as they can enable employees to travel more actively and sustainably.

Businesses are already starting to recognise the needs of their workforce, providing flexible working hours and facilities like cycle parking and showers. In turn, they can benefit from an increasingly healthy and productive workforce and attractive working environment for their employees.

Across the region, employees are supported by behaviour change projects to help their staff travel more sustainably. Organisations across Bristol's North Fringe have worked together with North Bristol SusCom to reduce congestion by promoting sustainable commuting options to around 40,000 employees.

We can go further to support employers' efforts to make sustainable travel the first choice for their workforce. Businesses can talk with their employees to understand their travel needs and cater for them accordingly. From home working to flexible start and finish times, flexible working arrangements can give employees the option to avoid the daily commute at peak hours or altogether. Continued investment in communications technology can reduce the need to travel for meetings and commutes alike.

Promoting the benefits of more active and sustainable travel by organising walking meetings, cycle training and offering incentives to those who make sustainable trips can all help to establish a sustainable travel culture.

Establishing fleet management schemes and priority parking for multiple-occupied cars can reduce parking pressures on businesses and incentivise car sharing. Facilities like secure cycle parking, showers and subsidised public transport ZPM make alternative options a simple and convenient choice for the everyday commute.

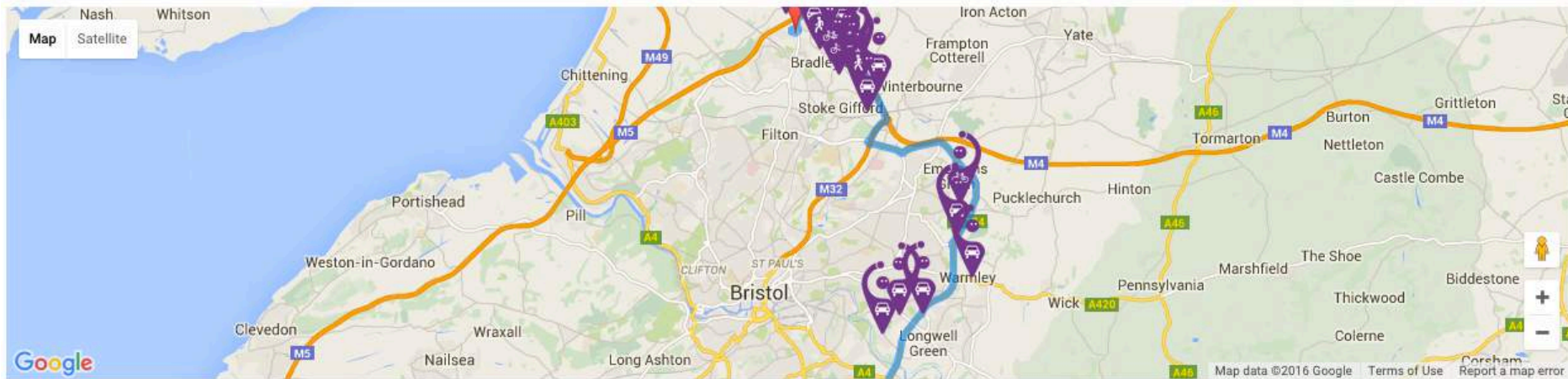

North Bristol SusCom Update –

Go Ultra Low Cities bid

West of England was one of four UK cities to be awarded Go Ultra Low Funding.



- **London** - £13m to create “Neighbourhoods of the Future” – on street car charging infrastructure (street lighting), Low Emission Zone, free parking and traffic priority to plug-in owners.
- **Milton Keynes** - £9m to open a City Centre Vehicle Experience Centre, open up 20,000 parking bays for free to electric vehicles, co-brand bus lanes and Low Emission Lanes.
- **Bristol** - £7m to deliver 100+ new charge points, 100 new council fleet ULEVs, 2 exemplar charging hubs (one at UWE), improved parking availability for ULEVs, free parking for EVs in P&R sites, reduced taxi license fees for ULEVs, on street ULEV charging/parking trial, community demonstrator cars, 35 organisations pledging 100 new ULEVs.
- **Nottinghamshire and Derby** - £6m to install 230 charge points and discounted parking for ULEV owners, access to 13 miles of bus lanes along key routes, new business support programme to let local companies try before they buy.
- Plus £5m for smaller initiatives in Dundee, Oxford, York and North East Region.
